STAGE 3 DROUGHT DECLARED

Mandatory and Voluntary Water Use Restrictions

Meiners Oaks Water District and its backup water supplier, Casitas MWD, have declared a Stage 3 drought condition. You must reduce your water use by 30% or more, compared to pre-drought usage. Water use restrictions are in effect, and will become more severe if the drought continues.

Voluntary Measures

- Please stop watering your lawn, unless you operate a day-care center or similar care facility. Lawns can be reseeded when the drought is over.
- Please stop watering non-profitable or marginal orchards.
- Please postpone planting flowers or a garden until the drought has ended.
- Cover your pool to reduce evaporation losses.
- Install low-flow showerheads, toilets, etc. if you haven't already done so.

Mandatory Water Use Restrictions

State law requires/allows us to issue fines for wasting water.

- ⊗ No outdoor irrigation between 10 AM and 6 PM.
- ② Do not irrigate any zone more than once per week.
- ② Do not irrigate in a manner to cause excessive runoff onto sidewalks, driveways, roads, etc.
- ⊗ No washing of concrete sidewalks, patios, driveways, roads, etc.
- ② Use a shutoff nozzle on the end of a hose when washing a car or watering plants.
- © No fountains or outdoor water features that are not recirculating.
- © Do not use potable water for dust control or compaction.
- ® No landscaping changes unless xeriscape (drought tolerant landscaping).
- © Restaurants shall serve glasses of water only upon request.

Recommended Irrigation Practices During the Drought

- Hand watering is allowed using a hose with a shutoff nozzle or a watering can.
- Deep soaking of plants should be done with a hose shut-off timer.
- ◆ Trees and large shrubs should be deeply irrigated no more than once or twice a month. You may use a drip hose placed in a circle within the drip-line of the tree, not too close to the trunk. Micro sprinklers may also be used.
- Irrigation of orchards with micro-sprinklers is OK.
- Place mulch under trees and shrubs to reduce irrigation water needs.
- This would be a good time to prune/trim your trees and shrubs, to reduce their water needs.
