The EPA is requiring all public water utilities (including Meiners Oaks) to submit a water service line inventory in order to document any lead service lines owned by either the utility or the customer. Lead was banned by the federal government in 1988, so if your home was built post-1988 we know that the line could not be lead.

Help Meiners Oaks comply with the EPA-mandated Lead & Copper Revised Rule by identifying the type of water line you have coming into your home. Any services that are not self-identified will have to be dug up by the utility in order to identify the line material. If you have any questions please call the office at **805-646-2114**.

## WATER LINE IDENTIFICATION

Please use this image to help identify the service line as it comes into your home. Typically you can identify the line material in your basement or crawl space where the line comes in through the foundation of the home.

	<ul> <li>Galvanized: A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet - strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.</li> </ul>
	Copper: The color of a copper penny.
	• Plastic: Usually white, rigid pipe that is jointed to water supply piping with a clamp. Note: It can be other colors, including blue and black.
- Statements (1) (1)	<ul> <li>Lead: A dull, silver-gray color that is easily scratched with a coin.</li> <li>Use a magnet - strong magnets will <u>not</u> cling to lead pipes.</li> </ul>
